Treasurer's Report

Steve Wills provided the Board with a detailed Treasurer's Report. Our net worth is substantially close to last month's having been decreased by our rent, utilities and Board approved expenditures.

In accordance with last month's Board directions he has opened a 2nd checking account with our present bank, PNC, to use with our trial of a credit/debit card processing by the Club. It is his recommendation that we use PNC's machine, at a final cost of \$399.00. This machine will not require a cell phone and provides a printed receipt. He would like to use it both for the Club Table and Admissions as well as payment of Annual Member dues.

Steve Wills' motion to purchase the PNC card reader was seconded by John Spach and passed unanimously.

Steve Wills' motion to follow the recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee to only waive the bank fee associated with the card processing for the payment of a full year's, or prorated full year's, dues was seconded by John Spach and passed unanimously.

Steve Wills thanked the Ways and Means Committee for their review of all of the Treasurer's Books. He also thanked Tom Garren for filling in for John Ragan's in his absence.

Tom Magnani 's motion to accept the Treasurers' Report was seconded by John Spach and passed unanimously.

a. Visit from Brookdale Assisted Living (Wake Forest)

b. Spring's Brick Universe Lego Fan Convention

Clif Kelly and Steve Wills presented this year's Spring's Brick Universe Lego Fan Convention which will be held the weekend of March 7th and 8th at the Raleigh Convention Center. Set up will be on Friday, March 6th, afternoon.

Steve reported that we will be located in the center of the room, away from any walls, which will require 5 – 6 volunteers for each shift to watch the corners, answer questions and present Club literature. Volunteers working the Club's layout will get free admission. Steve recommended that Volunteers bring their own lunches

Clif will distribute a sign-up sheet at February's Membership meeting. Tom Magnani is to do the same by email.

c. Next Club Open House (21 March 2020, Snow Date 28 March))

The next Club Open House will be March 21st with the 28th as a snow date. The 'Back Shop' door needs to be locked for the entire day.

d. Thomasville Train Weekend (25 – 26 April)

The Thomasville Train Weekend will be on April 25th and 26th at the Thomasville Civic Building. Mike Keelean is the lead and is working to establish contact with the person running the show to confirm our invitation and the space available for any layouts. He and George Sawyer are planning on staying in the Thomasville area for Friday and Saturday nights. They are planning on bringing the Club's traveling O and

N gauge layouts. If there is room they will arrange for the traveling S Gauge layout to be there as well.

e. Spring Show (2 - 3 May)

George Lasley reported that he has sold all but 23 of the approximately 150 tables as of today. The vendor mailing is due to go out this week. He is considering asking the fairgrounds to put us on the waiting list for the Exposition Building for the first weekend in May for 2021.

The Gov. W. Kerr Scott building has 19,500 square feet of exhibition space. The Exposition Center building 50,000 sq. ft. The Jim Graham building, home of our Fall Show, has 95,000 sq. ft. of space.

The Club's Spring Show, Spring into Trains, will be the weekend of May 2nd and 3rd with set up being on Friday May 1st beginning at 2 PM and most likely ending at 8 PM.

Discussion of Development of the Back Shop, Dust Collection System

Mike Keelean thanked his committee for the work they had done while he was out. The power tools have been relocated into the Back Shop. The peg boards are up. A work bench has been constructed. A dust collection system has been designed and the committee recommends purchasing a physically smaller vacuum that will fit under the bench rather than using the present shop vac which would take up valuable floor space. George Sawyer provided a detailed description of the system of hoses, gates (approximately \$10/tool) and fittings that would enable a functional system. He also recommended a power control system so that when a tool is energized the vacuum is already running.

Mike Keelean's motion for authorization to spend up to \$500 for the vacuum system and a few new tools was seconded by Steve Wills and passed unanimously.

John Spach reported that Dan Egy has donated an oscilloscope.

John Spach reported that Ron Abraham has donated safety glasses, hearing protection and masks.

Report on Annual Collection for Local Charities

George Lasley reported that the \$325 collected from the membership has been matched by the club. It was donated to the Baptist Men's Hurricane Relief Fund.

There was a general discussion of the need to develop a backup for the Web site and for the Whistle Post as well as a need for the Secretary and President to get their materials to the Whistle Post editor in a more timely fashion.

Mike Johns invited the club members to see his Railroad to the Sea.

Wayne Aiken pointed out that we have different email addresses for the club on various media, business card, and printed materials. We also need to ensure consistency between the Web site and Facebook.
