- On Sunday the building is open at 8 am, and the show is again 9-5. Tear down and return to the clubhouse follows.

Product Review: Airbrush Bottle Cap Covers by Tom Garren

I have always thought it inconvenient to pour unused paint back into the retail container after painting with an airbrush. This is especially true if you are working with a color you have mixed. I wanted to find something that would let me leave the paint in the airbrush bottle but prevent it from drying out.



I found one such product a few months ago on Amazon. What I found was airbrush bottle cap covers. They are sold in a package of 30 covers for less than \$7.00. To use them, you simply slide one of the covers over

the siphon tube of the airbrush bottle. This allows you to store the paint in the bottle with the siphon tube still in place. You should also cover the vent hole in the bottle lid with a piece of masking tape. By using this process, I have successfully maintained usable acrylic paint in an airbrush bottle for several months.

Once in a while, you find a product that looks too good to be true. In this case, the product did exactly what it is supposed to do. Using this product has saved me both time and paint. Hope it will be useful for you too.

Steve Wills wanted to add a small, 9" turntable at one end for which the Board had requested more information. Subsequently the HO group decided to let him add it. Ted said that Steve is developing the paperwork for an Operating Session that will take 2 hours to run.

8. Appeal for Articles and Pictures of Interest for the Whistle Post--Clif Kelly and Ken Howard. Ken needs articles, links and photos 10 days prior to the 3rd Thursday of the month for the Whistle Post.

11. Adjournment — Clif Kelly.

Tom Magnani made a motion to adjourn at 8:13 pm, seconded by Mike Keelean and passed unanimously.

There was no after meeting program planned.

Minutes of the Board of Governors' Meeting of March 1st, 2021

1. Call Meeting to Order and Roll Call – Clif Kelly and Tom Garren and Tom Magnani. The meeting, Zoom and in-person, was called to order at 7:00 pm by Clif Kelly. Those attending in person: Wayne Aiken*, Tom Garren*, Ken Howard, Mike Keelean*, Clif Kelly*, George Lasley, Mike Marsh and Richard Nyce, his 1st meeting. Those attending by Zoom were: Ron Abraham, Richard Calfee*, Jerry Davis, Bill Ferguson, Ted Kunstling, Tom Magnani*, Mike Mannella, Peter Ring, John Spach* and Steve Wills. Attending as guests by Zoom were: Bob Witwer, his 2nd meeting, and John Russo his 1st meeting.

- 2. Recognition of New Members and Visitors Mike Keelean and Clif Kelly.

 Tonight, we have Richard Nyce, his 1st meeting, Bob Witwer, his 2nd meeting, and John Russo his 1st meeting, as our guests and intending to become Senior Members.
- 3. Discussion About the HO Layout and Turntable Options Steve Wills

 Steve provided the Board with a summary of the reasoning and planning that went into his purchase of a 10" (72 scale feet) turntable. A 130 scale foot turntable is about 24" diameter footprint and too big for our layout. The 10" one will handle most of the locomotives that usually run on the layout and will enable switching operations. He left his yard plans laid out on the layout for the Board to view.

He is considering adding a 2^{nd} one at the other end of the layout. John Spach noted that the Board has authorized money for the 1^{st} turntable and related changes to the layout and that the HO group will need to come back to the Board for a 2^{nd} turntable.

Steve's single person operations sheet which will take two hours to complete is in a holder near the room's door.

4. Treasurer's Report – Mike Keelean.

Mike Keelean gave the treasurer's report.

Most of the increase in total monies has been due to table rental receipts.

All members have now paid their dues. Most of our younger members, five Youth and two Junior, dropped out because of warnings for younger people not to put elder people at risk. They will be readmitted beginning with June 1st and payment of next year's dues. They will be asked to work at our show table. He will be contacting them.

5. Report on "Spring into Trains Show," 30 April – 2 May 2021 – George Lasley
Our tables and TCA's are sold out. Waiting list for 8 tables. Will print more flyers.

Working on getting indoor snack and drink carts.

We need participation from everybody to help with this show.

Non-members are welcome as volunteers. This appeal for help will continue to be made as we get closer to the show dates.

WRAL advertisements are done. The N&O is a work in progress.

Ted Kunstling will talk with John Ragan about purchasing a Facebook Boost.

6. Outlook for Spring and Summer, 2021 – Clif Kelly.

He would like to have an Open House in July or August. Expects that we will still require masks, etc. but with a limit of 25 people. Mike Keelean said that our past weekends have almost been Open Houses with excellent attendance. Ted Kunstling thinks that the new COVID strains will make their effects known in about a month.

7. Conduct of Spring Election – George Lasley

George Lasley explained at February's General/Membership Meeting that the At-Large Board members have the duty of soliciting the membership for candidates.

Five positions are on the ballot: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Senior At-Large Member. The only position with a term limit is that of the President who is limited to five (5) 1-year terms.

Any Senior Member in good standing is eligible to vote.

Nominations are opened at March's Membership Meeting; beginning the election process with the polling of the Membership is done by the three At-Large Members of the Board. [The At-Large Board Members are: (Wayne Aiken, Richard Calfee, and Tom Garren).] The senior At-Large Director, Richard Calfee, will be rotating off the Board and is Chairman of the Nominating Committee.

The At-Large Board members are charged with the duty of soliciting the membership for candidates.

Nominations are taken from the floor. If someone chooses to nominate another member that member must agree to the obligation.

The nominations are closed at the April 15th Membership Meeting. The ballots are USPS mailed to the membership.

At the May 20th Membership Meeting, the vote is taken and all ballots are counted, both in person and absentee. Results are announced and the new officers are installed in June.

8. Signup Sheets for March and April Work Hours at the Club – Tom Garren

Tom has sign-up sheets, to address the lack of coverage during our stated open hours, available for March and April. Each time slot is for 1 hour.

Richard Calfee noted that one of our sites says we are open until 5 pm and needs to be corrected.

During a member's sign-up time they are expected to act as greeters, answer questions about the club, provide membership flyers and applications, make introductions, ask visitors to sign in, turn on layouts as requested, and to monitor the front door.

Ted Kunstling asked that we have a check-off list for turning off the club's power and layouts posted at the door.

Tom Magnani's first attempt at a wireless chime would not work due to the way the present door button is mounted, exposed to the elements. Additionally, it would not monitor the opening of the door. He will do a detailed inspection of the door circuit in the coming week. A cow bell hanging from the door was suggested. A combined function, doorbell and door opening, was requested.

9. Call for Articles and Pictures of Interest for the Whistle Post – Clif Kelly and Ken Howard Ken wants to develop a backlog of information, materials, links, photos and videos, book reviews, etc.

He is also looking for ideas for new or different content.

Tom Magnani is to send out an email requesting content donations.

Bernie Dawson, club webmaster, would also be a recipient of these materials.

10. New Business – Clif Kelly.

George Lasley dropped off a two-box donation of HO and N.

George has been offered a six-section, racked, 26' x 8', G scale layout, including scenery and rolling stock, located in Pinehurst, in exchange for a donation letter. It needs to be retrieved by March 15th and then stored until our May show as the sections are too big to fit through our door. Ron Abraham volunteered his garage. It was decided to do an inspection/retrieval trip.

Tom Garren used an email of February 24th (in which a nonmember asked for help with an N Gauge layout) as an example of a regular communication for which we need a response procedure and designated person.

11. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 8:17 pm.
