The Neuse River Valley Model Railroad Club will close out another Fiscal Year on May 31<sup>st</sup>. **What a year it has been!!** I wish to acknowledge the extraordinary effort, dedication and leadership exhibited by the Board of Governors and Club Members during this trying time of the Covid-19 virus. Due to the extent and seriousness of the virus in the spring of 2020, the Board of Governors took the unprecedented action of extending the slate of Officers for one additional year commencing on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

Our normal routine was severely restricted, and the Club was closed for a period of time in the spring. Ted Kunstling receives a special recognition for his untiring efforts in bringing Zoom technology to the Club so that members could attend Board and Membership Meetings offsite. In person meetings became a reality again during the summer, with attendance initially limited to ten persons and observing strict masking and social distancing protocols. The number of members attending in person has gradually increased since then.

George Lasley, Show Grand Poobah, is recognized for his extraordinary vision and perseverance during a time of great public fear to organize, plan, and execute the Fall Show in November. The Show was well received. Ticket sales were supplemented by brisk Club table sales, generating a modest profit. The “Spring into Trains Show” was also well received and generated a more favorable bottom line. Thanks again to everyone who participated for their help to make both shows a big success.

Bernie Dawson has been recently designated as the Club Webmaster, replacing John Ragan who has assisted with the transition. The efforts and long work hours contributed by John Ragan, Tom Garren and Bernie Dawson, working with the WRAL Design Team, have produced a revamped model railroading website second to none in the Southeast. This extension of our previous three-year lease will assure that the Club has a stable location and manageable rental costs through December 31, 2024. We consider ourselves fortunate to have this property for our Clubhouse use through the foreseeable future and extend our appreciation to Mr. Fisher for his generosity.

Thanks to Joe Johnston, who faithfully published the Club newsletter for many years. Ken Howard now serves as the “Whistle Post” editor. He receives content, organizes materials, assembles, edits and manages publication with assistance from a select group of Senior members who help proofread drafts, offer comments, post to the Website and distribute the newsletter



electronically the weekend before the Membership Meeting. Deadline for contributions is Wednesday, the week preceding the Membership Meeting. Great job Ken.

The growing need to maintain social media content has resulted in designation of a new Social Media Chair. Thanks to John Ragan who maintained this program for years. The new chair position more formalizes the content management. Thanks to Ted Kunstling for stepping up to meet this challenge.

George Lasley and Jerry Davis have been designated “sole surviving” active charter members. Because of his constant presence at Club activities, George has been deemed the Club “Historian.” His memory far surpasses the longevity of our most long-lived Club members. Thank you George, for formally accepting this vital Club role.

For those of you who appreciate really neat models, Fred Krauss passed along this photo of a Seaboard "round roof" boxcar model in O-scale. The model was created by Richard Scott, who modified a Lionel SAL boxcar - converting it to 2-rail with new wheelsets and couplers. Additionally, he added uncoupling levers and brake hoses and replaced the clunky, cast-on brackets that supported its roof-walk ends.

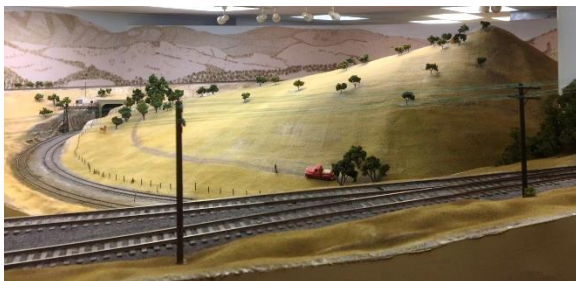

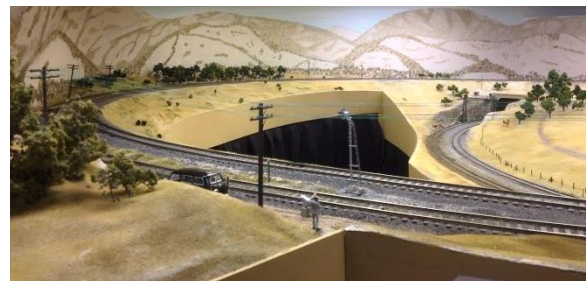


### Jerry Davis Layout:

## Minutes of the Membership Meeting of April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021

1. Call Meeting to Order, Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call – Clif Kelly and Tom Magnani (Secretary).

The meeting was called to order by Clif Kelly at 7:00 pm.

Randy Foulke attended at the Club house for his second meeting

Those attending by Zoom were: Doug Alumbaugh, Jerry Davis, Scott Hall, Michael Irwin, Ted Kunstling, Tom Magnani, Peter Ring, and George Sawyer.

2. Recognize Visitors and Applications for Prospective Members – Clif Kelly.

This is Randy Foulke's 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting having previously attended one of the Breakfast Meetings. (Randy had been a member 20+ years ago.) Mike Keelean's motion to wave the rules and to admit Randy Foulke as a Senior Member was seconded by Tom Garren and approved unanimously.

3. Treasurer's Report – Mike Keelean.

Mike Keelean gave the Treasurer's report.

The \$400 that the Board allotted for the New yard on the HO layout has been expended.

4. Report by Nominations Committee on Slate of Officers for Spring Elections – Clif Kelly

Richard Calfee opened the nomination process and presented the Slate of Officers.

President - Clif Kelly or John Spach

Vice President - Wayne Aiken

Secretary - Thomas Garren

Treasurer - Michael Keelean

At Large - Richard Calfee

The ballots will be distributed to all Senior Members in good standing. They are to be filled out but, NOT signed. Once inserted into the return envelope and the return envelope sealed the voter is to sign his name across the flap of the envelope. Everyone is urged to mail their ballots.

The ballot envelopes will not be opened until the counting of the vote during the May Membership Meeting. If a voter is able to attend the May 20<sup>th</sup> Membership Meeting, he or she may ask for their unopened ballot and vote in person.

Tom Magnani is to prepare the ballots and distribute them to all Senior Members in good standing.

5. Receive Any Nominations from the Floor and Close Nominations – Clif Kelly

No nominations were made from the floor. George Lasley's motion to accept the Committee's recommendations and to close the nominations was seconded by Mike Keelean and approved unanimously.

6. Update Report on “Spring into Trains Show” (30 April- 2 May) – George Lasley.  
George reported that the Food and the Drink Carts will be there. After some discussion it was decided to go with Doug Alumbaugh’s enclosed trailer, rather than Mike Marsh’s open truck in case it is raining that weekend.

He has a waiting list of 14 – 15 vendors.

Access will be through the gate on Trinity Road. (Trinity Rd. runs parallel to Hillsboro Street.)

George will be at the Kerr Scott Building at 10 am Friday, April 30<sup>th</sup> and will need a few members for help beginning at 10 am. Additional help will be needed once the vendors arrive at noon. Plastic ‘grocery’ bags are needed for our table.

Loading at the Clubhouse will also be at 10 am Friday, April 30<sup>th</sup>. The show’s hours are 9 am – 5 pm Saturday & Sunday. Staffing by Club members and friends is needed:

Friday, April 30 <sup>th</sup>	10 am – 5 pm+
Saturday, May 1 <sup>st</sup>	7 am – 6 pm+
Sunday, May 2 <sup>nd</sup>	8 am – 8 pm as needed for the vendors to pack.

The credit card reader will only be for sales at our table and for tickets and will be kept at the ticket table. Club table purchasers requiring a card transaction will be sent to the ticket table with a copy of the receipt. Once the card transaction has taken place the receipt will be marked as paid and the purchaser will return to the Club table to get items.

7. Report on Status of Club Open House for Saturday, April 17, 2021 – Clif Kelly  
The open house will be from 10 am – 4 pm. We will be cleaning the Clubhouse tonight. Everyone is requested to wear their Club shirts, nameplates and hats.

There will be no baked goods or cookies. Only soft drinks with cups & ice. 8 oz cans are preferable.

8. Interest in Spencer Train Show at NC Transportation Museum, 22-23 May – George Lasley  
George reported that the status of the Spencer Train Show appears to be in flux with the number of days seeming to vary from day-to-day. If the Club decides to organize a trip, it will be done after our May show.

9. Appeal for Membership Support During Club Visiting Hours – Clif Kelly and Tom Garren.  
Tom Garren has been providing sign-up sheets for March, April and May. Coverage, by Senior Members with keys, to open and to lock up, is improving to cover the Club from 10 am – 2 pm for Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays.

Non-key holding members are always advised to call the Club at 919-400-5570 to confirm that a senior member will be there for them, so that they will not make a trip in vain.

10. Appeal for Articles and Pictures of Interest for the Whistle Post – Clif Kelly and Ken Howard.

Clif Kelly thanked Ken Howard for the changes he has made to the Whistle Post. Ken thanked everyone for their articles, links and photos. While he can't directly use video's he hands the links over to Tom Garren for posting on our website and to Ted Kunstling for our social media postings.

Tom Garren and Tom Magnani were thanked for their editorial support; and Ted Kunstling for both his Facebook and Zoom support.

Ted Kunstling will authorize photographs on our Facebook site once the member posts them.

11. Call for New Business – Clif Kelly.

Tom Garren reported that the funeral service for probationary member Bob Patterson will be this Saturday. Bob had been in the process of rejoining the Club when he died. His wife made a donation in his name.

Clif Kelly noted that Kim Parker's wife died recently and asked for us to keep Kim in our prayers

John Ragan asked that we keep Mike Johns' grandson, who has cancer, in our prayers.

John Spach explained that the Club is now selling some of our high value donations on eBay. The reason for 'high value items' is due to the labor involved in packing and shipping. While the buyer pays the shipping costs, eBay processes all of the financial items, pays state taxes and collects a fee. In effect, it costs us about 10% for every sale. To date, he has been able to sell 8 items.

George Lasley reported that the Tichy Train Group is having a sale, through the weekend, to cover the cost of a new roof on their manufacturing facility. Tom Magnani will email their notice to the Club.

12. Adjournment – Clif Kelly.

George Sawyer's motion to adjourn at 8:05 PM was seconded by George Lasley and passed unanimously.

There was no Program following the Membership Meeting. This time will be used to clean up the Clubhouse for the Open House planned for Saturday, April 17<sup>th</sup>.

## **Minutes of the Board of Governors' Meeting of May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021**

1. Call Meeting to Order and Roll Call – Tom Garren (On-site Sec) and Tom Magnani (Zoom Sec).

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by Clif Kelly.

Those attending by Zoom were: Ted Kunstling and Tom Magnani\*.

2. Recognition of New Members and Visitors – Mike Keelean and Richard Calfee.

There were no visitors tonight.

3. Treasurer's Report – Mike Keelean.

Mike presented the Treasurer's report with preliminary numbers from the weekend's show. We made some money for the Club. John Spach reported that all of the high value items that had been placed on eBay were sold.

4. Preliminary Report on Recent "Spring into Trains Show," 30 April - 2 May 2021 – George Lasley.

George thanked everyone who came to help. We had enough of a turnout that all of our members and supporters in attendance had a chance to visit the vendors and the various layouts.

The dealers seemed pleased. There were 2 vendors who did not show up. Both forfeited their table payments as they had not contacted George in advance.

Our Club Table seemed busy, with very few books remaining.

Total paid attendance was 860; 573 on Saturday and 283 on Sunday. Reattenders, using tickets purchased on Saturday for attendance on Sunday, were not tracked. Additionally, an estimated 300-400 children, all non-paying, attended.

Everything was over by Sunday at 8:10 pm.

5. Report on Results of Spring Open House (April 17<sup>th</sup>) – Clif Kelly and Mike Johns.

Clif thanked everyone who helped with the Open House. Because of the COVID there were no snacks this year, only small sized drinks. 25 people signed the Guest book. He estimates that we had about 40 visitors, including children. Three people filled out Membership applications.

There was a discussion about when Membership applications should be filled out and whether we should have an 'Information' Sheet for use when people express a possible Club interest. George Lasley referenced the By-Laws, "ARTICLE II – MEMBERSHIP, 2. Applicants for membership must attend 2 meetings within a period of 60 days and submit a membership application."

6. Interest in Spencer Train Show 23-24 May – George Lasley.  
George reported that there does not seem to be much enthusiasm among the membership for this event at the State museum in Spencer. He is not sure whether it will be for one or two days. At this time there is no Club event planned
7. Referral to HO Committee on Possible Purchase of 130 ft. turntable from Show – Clif Kelly.  
There was a general discussion about the HO group's need to present the Board with a plan describing location and pricing. Steve Wills will develop a template for its location to ensure that it will fit at the inside end and will function as expected. His template will become the basis for the presentation to the Board.
8. Signup Sheets for May and June Work Hours at the Club – Tom Garren.  
Tom reported that the sheets for April seemed to have worked. He has sheets at the Clubhouse for May and June.
9. Call for Articles and Pictures of Interest for the Whistle Post – Clif Kelly and Ken Howard.  
Clif thanked Ken Howard for all his work on the Whistle Post as well as both Tom Garren and Tom Magnani for their editing support. Ken reported that he is building an inventory of articles and home layout photographs. Steve Wills will leave a USB stick at the Clubhouse with his photographs from the Open House and the Train Show for Ken.
10. Call for New Business – Clif Kelly.  
There was a request for Tom Magnani to rearrange the roster and email address list into members and non-members.  
  
John Spach's motion to award Ruth and Keith Bell, the sister and brother-in-law of Steve Wills, Honorary Life Membership for their extensive HO Donation was seconded by Mike Keelean and unanimously approved.  
  
John Spach described eBay's requirement for a separate checking account to be used exclusively for the Club's eBay, sales and returns, transactions. His motion to create a 3<sup>rd</sup> checking account exclusively for eBay transactions was seconded by Mike Keelean and unanimously approved.
11. Adjournment.  
A motion to adjourn was made by Tom Garren and seconded by Mike Keelean. It passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 8:08 pm.
