New Policy for Youth Attendance

As outlined above in John Spach's "All Aboard," the Board of Governors has adopted a policy to protect Youth members, young guests, and the Club. Please read and understand the intent and specific implementation of this new requirement. The specific policy is included below:

"If a minor Youth or Junior member with a parent or guardian requires admission to the building, there must be either two Senior members or one Senior member and one Associate member present while the minor is in the Clubhouse. The only exception to this is if the parent or guardian of the minor is also a Senior or Associate member of the Club."

S-scale Layout News by Ron Abraham

The S scale layout is getting bigger and better. First, we have two new S gaugers in the Club - Bill and Darlene Edwards. Second, we are upgrading the locomotives to DC power for more reliable operation. And third, the layout has expanded four inches from the wall to accommodate large steam locomotives. Bill brought his "Big Boy" last Saturday (way cool).

Finally, I am asking all members to search their attics, basements, storage sheds for your old American Flyer trains and track, especially track with rubber roadbed.

Member Input Needed for Club Inventories

The Club is trying to complete an inventory of its equipment on each of the layouts for tax purposes. This process has been particularly difficult for the HO layout because of the large amount of privately owned rolling stock and locomotives that seem to be permanently stored on the layout. It is important that the Club clarify the ownership of all rolling stock so that an appropriate inventory can be prepared for future reference and tax filings.

While the modules are the property of the Club, an additional issue has been raised about ownership of certain buildings and structures on portions of several layouts and whether or not they are considered privately owned. It is the policy of the Club that all buildings, track and scenic additions to any layout become the property of the Club. This question is important to resolve for **all** of the layouts in the Clubhouse.

What the Club wishes to obtain are the following items:

- 1) A description of any engines and rolling stock that individual members have on the layout that are personal property. The description should include sufficient information to positively identify the items in question (e.g. engine type and number, car type and number, railroad). Items not described or removed from the layout will be considered property of the Club and included in the new inventory.
- 2) Any claim to structure, buildings, or accessories that the member considers personal property that could be removed from the Club layouts for any person. If no claims are filed for such materials, they will be considered the property of the Club.

Thank you all for your assistance. As we grow as an organization, the amount of equipment in use at the Club is also growing. This is a good point in time to clarify ownership issues for materials In the Clubhouse. Request for Help with Lego Brick Universe Show

Steve Wills is asking for help to exhibit the Lego layout at the Lego Brick Universe show. While the show takes place on September 25th and 26th, help is needed other days to get the layout torn down, transported, and set up at the show. Here are the specific needs:

Sept 18th and 19th - take down and packing at the Clubhouse

Sept 24th - car/van loading (need at least three) and setup – Steve requests that this start at the Clubhouse about noon.

Both Sept 25th and 26th - **Steve needs at least 3 helpers** (more is better) for both morning and afternoon shifts - hours are 8 to 4:30 PM. Odd, but they are doing 3 - 2 ½ hour windows. 8 to 10:30, 11 to 1:30, and 2 to 4:30.

Sept 26th - evening after 4:30 breakdown and load up.

Oct 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} - help setting up the layout - 1 to 3 is all that are needed.

Steve suggests the 25^{th} and 26^{th} shifts as 8 to 12:30 and 12 to 4:30, or it could be just for the 2 ½ hours for each show but recommend two shifts. Steve will be there for all days and shifts. There are a few more people needed to assure that we have help to hand out flyers for our Fall show.
