## February 19<sup>th</sup> Work Session by Tom Garren



On Saturday, February 19, 2022, a group of members gathered at the Club for two reasons: first, to move the N scale layout to its new location; and second, to begin the process of learning how to install a DCC decoder in a DC locomotive.

At 9:45 am, a group of members moved the N scale layout to its new home without a problem. This clears the area designated for the HO layout expansion. The wall rack for storage of N scale trains also moved to its new location near the door of the layout room. Good job guys.

For the second activity, we gathered in the meeting room for a session led by Wayne Aiken on decoder installation. This was a learning experience in which we discovered that there is more to learn, depending on the specific locomotive, before we can successfully install a decoder. This work will continue, and knowledge will be shared once it is obtained. On a positive note, one Club locomotive, an Atlantic Coast line E7, was found to already be DCC equipped once the body was removed. With a bit of work on the test track, the locomotive now successfully runs and makes sounds under DCC control.

## **HO Layout Committee Activities**

Two sessions (February 17<sup>th</sup> and February 21<sup>st</sup>) were held at Bob Witwer's storage module in Clayton for Club members to examine the approximately 40 modules that we received as a donation. The sessions were sparsely attended, but three modules were purchased by members. Additionally, the procedures necessary to salvage equipment and prepare the modules for use in the HO expansion were worked out. Modules and equipment that will not be used by the Club are available for member purchase.

Thanks to Richard Calfee and Tom Tieman for their efforts in reworking the support legs on the end modules of the current layout. The legs no longer protrude into the aisle space around the layout – a significant hazard to navigation has been removed!

## Member Layout

### **ROCK CREEK DIVISION: A Work in Progress by Ted Kunstling**

Like some of you, retirement has allowed me time and resources to return to past pleasures. My 60-year-old HO trains had somehow miraculously survived multiple moves and younger brothers before resurrection in 2018. The structures, rolling stock, and "Little Joe" Varney tank engine were in surprisingly good condition, although the Atlas Flex track was long gone. I added a

basic Bachmann starter train, set up a 4x8 foot sheet of plywood in my basement workshop, purchased more E-Z Track, and began running trains again. I brushed up on old modeling skills and learned new ones building structures, scenery, and rolling stock. The miracle of DCC meant I would not need to create a complicated system of blocks, but this too has a learning curve. I began frequenting Nick's Trains for gear and advice, until Nick finally suggested I visit the Neuse River Valley Model Railroad Club. Wonderful advice!

In 2020, opportunity knocked. A friend of a friend had lost her husband and was preparing to move to a new home. Her husband had amassed a quantity of HO equipment and had a working layout (below) but had not yet begun to install scenery. Many structures and scenery resources were still in original boxes. After visiting her, I pondered for several days then made an offer. Soon, I was moving up to the next level, creating an 8 x 13 foot layout in my basement.



<u>Planning</u> followed an "evolutionary" approach, beginning with resources I had accumulated. Liking the NRVMRR Club layout, I decided on a rectangular configuration with access on all sides and open center. I had plenty of Sievers Benchwork and a large inventory of Bachmann E-Z Track, so that is what I used to develop and assemble a layout, enabling me to begin running trains right away. Ultimately, I came up with 2 and 7/8 complete loops and a staging yard. The 7/8 loop serves industrial sidings with several spurs.

### Thanks for Sharing Knowledge by Tom Garren



I got out of model railroading in 1985. When I returned to the hobby, so very much had changed. One of the most mystifying, at least to me, was DCC. Many of the things we dreamed about 40 years ago is now possible with DCC.

One thing that was scary to me was the concept of installing a decoder in a locomotive myself.

The only motive power I saved from my HO days in the seventies and eighties are a pair of Athearn F7s that I had painted in my private road scheme of those years. Before trying to convert them to DCC, I knew I had to gain knowledge, confidence, and experience.

Thanks to our Club and members' willingness to share information and help others develop skills, I can now say the initial mystery is behind me. I knew we had some blue box Athearn locomotives that needed to have decoders installed. I talked about trying to install a basic DCC chip in a Southern switcher with John Spach. He said he would be glad to help me and felt that we could be successful. To prepare for this work, I watched some videos on adding DCC to Athearn blue box engines on Youtube.

When the day came, John Spach and I met in the Clubhouse shop and began the work. John provided tips in addition to the ones I had gained from the videos. He also let me do most of the work. When it came time to test the loco, it ran first time on DCC. While I am no expert in this activity, I do have a much better understanding of how to proceed next time, and a much higher comfort level when I try again.

I thanked John for his help and was informed that he had learned from Dan Egy and was just passing on the knowledge to another Club member. To me this is a very big advantage of our Club. We have many members with lots of different skills who are willing to share with others. Just ask and enjoy the Club.
