- In this presentation I will walk you through the creation of the latest in my NRV collection, Class B1 2-8-4 Berkshire #8104!


Brief Alternate History

- The NRV berks were built in 1942 by Lima and were classified as the B1 Class.
- The NRV had 12 berks with 8104 being the 5th in the class.
- 8104 and the rest of her class was retired in 1965.
- After retirement, the locomotive was preserved and was tapped in 1975 to pull excursions and the Freedom Train on the NRV.
- Today 8104 can still be found today pulling excursion trains.

NRV Steam Specs

- Centered headlight on the smokebox.
- Smokebox mounted bell.
- Whistle mounted at an angle on the steam dome.
- Yellow Roman Lettering
- Graphite Smokebox
- Red Roof and tender deck


