7. Communications with the Club

Ken Howard reported that we have received two donations. The first is a donation of books from Gary Carlson. Second, we have received a donation of an HO layout from the north Raleigh area. Additionally, we are scheduled to get another HO layout donation from a gentleman in Hurdle Mills next Wednesday.

8. Committee Reports

a. Membership Committee

Tom Garren reported that we have three guests tonight. Jack McDonald is attending his first meeting. We also have Greg Severson and Cat Flynn with us tonight. Both have satisfied the two meeting requirement for membership. Greg has applied for Senior membership. He models in HO specializing in Western and Canadian roads. Cat has applied for Associate membership. She models in S gauge and is looking forward to working with our S gauge group. She likes Southern roads, especially the Savanah and Atlanta route.

b. Ways and Means

c. House

Library – Wayne Aiken reported on the donation we received from Gary Carlson. It includes several books on short lines mostly in the North East, but with one book on the short lines of North and South Carolina. Be sure and check out these new books. At this time we have 2,820 books in the Library and almost 13,000 magazines.

Facilities – Mike Hinman had nothing new to report this month.

d. Engineering Committee

N scale – Bernie Dawson reported that much work is being done on the permanent layout. So far, one reversing loop has been added and another one is under construction. More scenery is needed. The N scale group is also looking at adding industry to create operations on the layout. Their next meeting will be in September when they will discuss more about ways to create operations.

Bernie also reported the push is on to have all the T-TRAK modules sceniced before the Fall show.

Z scale - Phil Michaud is building a 4'x2' layout in Z scale. He is using Micro Trains equipment. He plans on bringing this layout to our Fall Open House on October 11th. Phil is planning on having both Canadian National and Canadian Pacific equipment on the layout. Bob Witwer asked Phil to also bring the layout to the Fall show.

Scott Hall said he could bring in a briefcase Z scale layout for Open House.

HO – Ken Howard reported that as of Wednesday everything was running on the HO layout. Chuck Larnerd is living under the layout repairing wiring and broken legs. New additions to the inventory include a set of Seaboard streamlined passenger cars.

Chuck Larnerd is preparing a map of the entire HO layout using Any Rail. One advantage to using the CAD program is that it will point out problems we have in the track. This will allow us to make repairs and upgrades where they are most needed.

O Gauge – George Sawyer reported that as of this afternoon Track 1 is not operational. He is installing a new switch and working on other track problems. The other tracks are working fine.

S Gauge – John Spach stated that George List reported there are no problems currently on the S gauge layout.

G Scale – John Spach reported that we still need to get a couple more power drops installed on the layout. Chuck Larnerd volunteered to install the drops prior to the October 11th Open House.

e. Program Committee

John Spach thanked Randy Foulke for taking over the Program Committee with the passing of John Wallis. Randy reported that we have programs lined up through May of 2026.

f. Social Committee

Randy Foulke reported that we currently have fourteen people signed up for the Aberdeen, Carolina and Western shop tour on September 5th. He believes there are a few more slots open. Please contact Randy quickly if you would like to go on the tour.

Randy also reported that he is beginning to plan for the annual Club dinner. Thoughts now are to go back to Golden Corral again. The date will probably be in early February. Randy is looking for a volunteer to help him make the arrangements for this event. John Spach noted that we also need someone to coordinate the gift exchange that was previously handled by John Wallis. Look for more information on this dinner in the next few months.

9. Old Business

a. Dues

John Spach noted that we are still looking for a volunteer to take over eBay sales for the Club. Until someone steps up, John will keep handling our eBay sales.

e. Social Media Presence

John Spach reminded everyone that we now have an Instagram account. He requests that all members get their own account, sign on, and follow our account. This will let us get a higher position in the algorithm. The same holds true for Facebook.

f. Fall Show

Bob Witwer reported that this year we will have a shared floorplan, meaning that the layouts will be interspersed with the vendor tables. The current plan gives us 559 tables with the capability to compress the floor plan and go to a maximum of 617 tables.

Bob announced the Craftsman Showcase. This will be a judged exhibit of models including locomotives, rolling stock, structures, dioramas, etc. One particularly interesting class is called Anything But. This means that you start with a structure of a station and kit bash it into a building of another use, i.e. anything but a station. It is very important to get the word out about this competition. Flyers specifically for the Craftsman Showcase are being prepared and will be distributed to hobby shops, clubs, and other places that may be interested in such an event.

We once again have seven Train Talks planned for the show.

A new feature of the Fall show will be a Scavenger Hunt. Participants will be given a ballot which they will fill out with information they find around the show floor on various layouts. The forms will be placed in a box and a winner will be pulled on Sunday afternoon.

Bernie Dawson discussed the staffing requirements for the show. Everyone is asked to sign up and work at least one shift at the Show. If a member is not on Bernie's list and comes to the show, they will be expected to pay the \$10.00 admission fee.

Bob Witwer reminded everyone that we expect all members to help at the show. This is our major fundraising activity, and the work is cannot be done by just ten or twelve people. Please sign up and help.

There will be no raffle layout this year, as it was deemed to not be cost effective.
