Minutes of the Membership Meeting of December 18, 2025

1. Call Meeting to Order

4. Minutes of the Last Meeting

Main 2 is undergoing construction. Contact Chuck if you would like to help so you can coordinate when to meet. He has recently trained two members in trackwork.

S gauge – George List thanked the Club for removing the empty boxes from in front of the S gauge layout.

O gauge – Nothing to report.

G scale – Alan Servas is working on the Bachman number 12 engine. Mike Hinman has volunteered to help with this project.

g. Program Committee
