Minutes of the Board of Governors' Meeting of February 02, 2026

1. Call Meeting to Order and Roll Call of Board

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President John Spach

6. Committee Reports

a. Membership

d. Engineering

N Scale – Nothing to report.

HO – Ken Howard reported the last HO committee meeting was held on January 18th. During that meeting a number of projects were set up that are underway now. These include:

- Trackwork being redone under the mountain to give three inches between tracks for easier setup of trains.
- Greg Rhee is working on the structure of Mt. Witwer. Plaster coating will follow soon.
- The problem track on Main 2 near the air conditioner has been redone and the second wye on Main 2 has been installed but has yet to be connected to a control panel.
- We have a plan to rework the trackwork on the Main 4 extension.
- We have two competing proposals for how to exit the yard on Module 4. Once this decision has been made work will progress. This work will provide a way to come out on a number of mains from either end of the yard. This will make the yard very useful for setup.
- The trees for the mountain are still on backorder.
- Chuck is out for a little while recovering from surgery.
- Several people are moving forward working on approved track plan projects.

S gauge – George List reported no change in the layout. He is excited to hear about a new member of the S gauge team.

O gauge – George Sawyer reported that the layout had been left with the power strips off, but with one of the throttles not closed. This could result in a surprise when someone

next turns on the layout. Please remember to close all the throttles, turn off all track switches, and turn off the power strip that powers the layout. Phil Michaud stated that he may have left the layout in that situation, thinking that was correct.

John Spach suggested that George Sawyer hold a session to teach other members the proper way to operate and power down the O gauge layout.

e. Program

Randy Foulke reported that we have programs scheduled through August of 2026.

f. Social

Randy Foulke reported that we had twenty five people at the Club dinner on January 16th.

Randy also reported that the trip to the Timonium show was canceled due to the weather.

7. Old Business

a. Spring Show
